Situation report regarding Flood/ Heavy rainfall as on 30th May, 2022 at 1800 Hrs.

1. Forecast:-

➤ **India Meteorological Department (IMD):**

	Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning/gusty winds	At isolated places very likely over East Madhya Pradesh; with lightning/gusty winds (speed 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph) at isolated places over Chhattisgarh, Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand and Bihar and with lightning at isolated places over Jammu & Kashmir Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, northeast Rajasthan, northwest Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha, Uttar Pradesh, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Odisha, Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Marathwada, Coastal Andhra Pradesh-Yanam, Telangana, Rayalaseema, Coastal & South Interior Karnataka, Tamilnadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep.
31.05.2022	Heavy rainfall	At isolated places very likely over Mizoram & Tripura, Assam & Meghalaya, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Assam-Meghalaya, Tamilnadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Kerala & Mahe.
	Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning/gusty winds	At isolated places very likely over Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand and Bihar and with lightning at isolated places over East Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Odisha, Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Konkan-Goa, Marathwada, Madhya Maharashtra, Coastal Andhra Pradesh-Yanam, Telangana, Rayalaseema, Coastal & South Interior Karnataka, Tamilnadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep.

➤ **Significant Weather Features:-**

- Conditions are favourable for further advance of southwest monsoon into some parts of central Arabian Sea, reaming parts of Kerala, some more parts of Tamil Nadu, some parts of Karnataka, and some more parts of south and Central Bay of Bengal, some parts of northeast Bay of Bengal and northeastern states during next 3-4 days.
- Under the influence of monsoonal westerly winds from Arabian Sea over the south peninsular India in lower & middle tropospheric levels, a cyclonic circulation over southeast Arabian Sea off north Kerala-Karnataka coast and a trough from the this cyclonic circulation to Southwest Bay of Bengal at lower tropospheric levels.
- Under the influence of east-west trough from northwest Rajasthan to north Bangladesh and southwesterly winds from Bay of Bengal to northeast India at lower tropospheric levels.

3. **Loss & Damage reported in Assam:-**

- The State of Assam has been facing severe Flood and Landslide for last sixteen days.
- At present 07 districts viz. Cachar, Dima-Hasao, Goalpara, Kamrup, Kamrup (M), Morigaon and Nagaon district have reported flood.
- NDRF, Indian Army, Civil Defence, Paramilitary forces, Indian Air force, WRD are helping the district administration in safe evacuation of people from affected areas apart from SDRF, Fire & ES personnel, Police forces, Aapda Mitra volunteers etc.
- So far **26,599** numbers of people have been safely evacuated by the above forces/ agencies.
- **32** persons have lost their life due to flood/landslide in this season (i.e. from 6th April, 2022).
- So far 80 MT of relief items has been provided to far flung areas like Harangajao, Khepre, Laisong, Hajadisa along with Haflong with the help of Indian Air Force
- **Uttarakhand:** - As per report received from SEOC Uttarakhand all stranded tracking team members rescued safely by Air Force and shifted at ITBP Hospital Gauchar for medical checkup.

Deployment of NDRF, Army and Air Force:-

(i) NDRF: -

- **Total 79** Teams of NDRF are deployed in flood affected areas in different parts of country including 08 teams in Assam to assist local administration for flood relief and rescue operation.

(ii) Deployment of Army in Assam:-

- Two colns and two Engineering task force (ETF) are deployed.
- One coln ex 18 Assam Rifles is on standby at Agartala for assistance in South Assam.
- Till now 1906 persons safely rescued/ evacuated by Indian Army.
- Restoration work of railway track /bridge is under way.

(iii) Indian Air Force:-

- Till now 819 persons rescued and 251.4 ton relief material air lifted by the Indian Air Force with the help of 06 helicopters (02-Mi17, 03- AN32, 01- CH47).
