Significant Weather Features

- A cyclonic circulation lies over south Gujarat & neighbourhood in lower & mid tropospheric levels and another cyclonic circulation lies over East Uttar Pradesh & neighbourhood in lower tropospheric levels. High convergence of strong moist westerly/southwesterly winds at lower tropospheric levels from the Arabian sea very likely along west coast till 06th July and over plains of northwest India & central India from 03rd July, 2020. Under its influence, fairly widespread to widespread rainfall activity with:
 - (i) Isolated heavy to very heavy rainfall with **isolated extremely heavy falls** is very likely over north Konkan on 03rd & 04th July; Gujarat region on 04th & 05th July and over Madhya Maharashtra on 04th July.
 - (ii) Isolated heavy to very heavy falls is also very likely over Coastal Karnataka during 02nd-04th July and over Saurashtra & Kutch during 04th-06th July.
- Scattered to fairly widespread rainfall with isolated heavy falls most likely over Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and East Uttar Pradesh during next 5 days.

- Northeast India and East India very likely to continue to receive fairly widespread to widespread rainfall activity with isolated heavy falls during next 5 days. **Isolated extremely heavy falls are very likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during next 48 hours.**
- Subdued rainfall activity over Western Himalayan Region and adjoining northwest India very likely to continue during next 2 days and its distribution & intensity very likely to increase thereafter.

2. Blowout in Gas well of Oil India Ltd.:

On 27/05/2020 at around 10:30 AM, the gas producing well of Baghjan 5 under Baghjan Field has suddenly become very active in Tinsukia District of Assam.

All the ongoing operations immediately suspended as the well was releasing Natural Gas in an uncontrolled manner. In order to arrest any untoward incidents of flash fire, Fire Tenders are kept ready at site.

Nodal Ministry: MoPNG- It is also to mentioned that as per CMP-2019 issued by Cabinet Secretariat, Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas is the nodal Ministry for Crisis in the Petroleum and Natural Gas Sector.

Deployment of NDRF: Two teams of NDRF are deployed at the place of incident.

- **Debris Removal:** The debris removal activity with continuous spraying /jacketing of water in the well plinth/debris is underway since morning

toady. 4 loads of debris amongst others, following major items were removed from the well plinth yesterday :

- 2 nos. of Mud Tanks
- 1 no. of Trip Tank
- 1 no. of Well Servicing Pump

- **Readiness of Equipment at Site:** Refilling of water reservoir to maintain the desired water level is being carried out by pumping water from Dangori river. Through preventive maintenance, standby equipment & accessories are made ready at site for water filling at water reservoirs and spraying/water jacketing and associated works. Depending on requirement, fabrication & repairing jobs are being carried out at the temporary workshop created near the site.
 - **Shifting of Debris from Lay Down Area:** To create space for laying debris from the blowout well plinth, 4 loads of debris from the laydown area have been transferred to the designated location at Duliajan.
 - **Civil work at Site:** Development of the new area for placing Kill Pumps near debris laydown area is in progress as the earlier site got submerged under water. Civil work at site is also being carried out on routine basis as per respective requirement.
 - **Transferring equipment/material to the site:** The Second Excavator attached with hydraulically operated Rock Breaker Unit has been transferred to the site today. Other equipment and materials are being transferred in a phased manner depending on requirement and site condition.
 - **Servicing of Equipment at OIL's CMT Yard:** Fabrication work of heat shield for 2nd Bull Dozer is completed. Servicing of standby engine/ pumps etc. are also in progress.
 - **Mobilization of Equipment from Outside:** Following equipment/materials reached Duliajan/Site yesterday/today.
 - 2 Trailers of Portable deck mats and pins from Kolkata reached on 01-07-2020. Rest of the two reached earlier.
 - **Equipment/Material mobilized from outside:** Following important equipment/ materials mobilized from outside are on transit. Consignments are delayed on transit due to heavy rain and heavy traffic jam enroute.
- 3. Environmental Impact Assessment:** The studies regarding air quality, noise level, gas presence and seismological tremors are in process
- **Air quality/Noise level/Gas presence monitoring by OIL:** Report dated 01.07.2020 is attached.

- **CSIR-NEIST Seismological Study:** Recording is in progress in the vicinity of Baghjan-5 well. Currently, 5 sets of sensors including an accelerometer are recording data.

4. Relief and Rehabilitation

- Surveys for Assessment of damage for compensation by the committee constituted by District Administration are in progress. Assessments for 32 more families were conducted yesterday in Doomdooma Circle making total number of families surveyed till date in Doomdooma and Tinsukia Circle 752 families. Areas being submerged under water due to flood, damage assessment in Tinsukia circle could not be carried out yesterday too.

5. Law and Order/Bandhs/Blockades etc.

- Law & order situation was normal till the time of reporting.

7. Any other Issues

- **Flood Effect on Road Connectivity to Site:** Currently, there is only one road available (Plastic Park–MaguriBeel side) for movement of heavy vehicles to the well site. The repairing work of the alternate road (Talap–Kordoiguri–Bandarkhati-Bhaghjan EPS) for entry into Baghjan EPS and the connectivity to the well is resumed after blockade by local people was lifted yesterday evening. The overall progress of the repairing work is 95%.
- **Weather Forecast of Baghjan:** It was raining for most of the time in the day today. Shower and thunderstorm with mostly cloudy weather is forecasted till next few days too. However, flood water has receded considerably in the area. Current weather forecast is as under.
