b. Significant Weather Features:

- **The well marked low pressure area over north Odisha and adjoining Gangetic West Bengal** along with associated cyclonic circulation extending upto upper tropospheric levels tilting southwestwards with height persists. It is very likely to move west-northwest and weaken gradually during next 2 days.
- **Under the above favorable scenario,** Widespread rainfall with isolated/ scattered heavy to very heavy falls most likely to continue over Gujarat state, Konkan & Goa (including Mumbai) and Madhya Maharashtra (ghat areas) till 6th August and reduce thereafter; isolated extremely heavy falls likely over Konkan & Goa and Madhya Maharashtra on 05th August and over Gujarat state on 05th August & 06th August.
