- (i) Landslide in Kerala: Landslide occurred in Tata tea Company Pettimudi Munnar Kerala. 43 persons have been reported dead and 27 persons are still missing. Search and Rescue operation continue by NDRF, Fire, Forest, Police, Emergency Response Team and Local Administration.
- (ii) Landslide at Karnataka Update: Landslides incidents occurred on 06.08.2020 in Karnataka- Bhramagiri hills, Bhagamandala, Madikeri Taluk. Search, search and rescue operation continues in Bramgiri Hills, Tala Cauvery, 04 people are missing.
