Significant Weather Features:

- A cyclonic circulation lies over northwest Rajasthan & neighbourhood in the lower tropospheric levels. Under the influence of the above systems, isolated Heavy rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning very likely over North Haryana and west Uttar Pradesh on 03rd September; over Himachal Pradesh, Rajasthan on 03rd & 04th September; over Uttarakhand during 03-07 September, 2020.
- A cyclonic circulation lies over eastcentral and adjoining southeast Arabian Sea off Karnataka & north Kerala coasts at lower & middle tropospheric levels. Under its influence, Fairly widespread to widespread rainfall with isolated heavy falls and thunderstorm & lightning very likely over Peninsular India during next 3-4 days. Isolated heavy to very heavy falls also very likely over coastal Karnataka on today, 3rd September, 2020.
- Moderate thunderstorms with lightening very likely over Rajasthan, Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh, & Delhi, Konkan & Goa, West Madhya Pradesh and Tamilnadu during next 12 hours.

4. Other Incident-

Landslide in Kerala Update: Landslide occurred on 07.08.2020 in Tata tea Company Pettimudi, Munnar, Kerala. 65 persons have been reported dead, 12 persons got injured and 05 persons are still missing. The first stage of searching has put to an end by the authorities because of the search of the fifth consecutive day goes in vain. Searching operation for the five missing persons will be resumed when the water level of the river will become normal.
