Significant Weather Features:

- A Well Marked Low Pressure Area lies over Westcentral Bay of Bengal & adjoining north Andhra Pradesh coast. The associated cyclonic circulation extends upto mid-tropospheric levels tilting southwestwards with height. It is very likely to move west-northwestwards across Telangana during next 2-3 days.
- Fairly widespread to widespread rainfall with isolated heavy falls very likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Maharashtra, Gujarat, Coastal & North Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe during next 4-5 days; over south Odisha today, the 14th September, 2020.
- Isolated heavy to very heavy falls are very likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema today; over Telangana on 14th & 15th; over North Interior Karnataka, Vidarbha and Marathwada on 16th; over Madhya Maharashtra on 16th & 17th and over Coastal Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe on 18th September. Isolated extremely heavy falls also likely over Telangana today, the 14 September, 2020.
