Significant Weather Features:

- A Well Marked Low Pressure Area lies over southern parts of Gangetic West Bengal & neighborhood. It is very likely to move westnorthwestwards across interior parts of Odisha and Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, north Chhattisgarh, north Madhya Pradesh and south Uttar Pradesh during next 4-5 days and weaken gradually.
- The monsoon trough is active and is very likely to remain active during next 2 days. In addition, the convergence of strong lower level southwesterly winds from Arabian Sea likely to continue over northwest during next 2 days.
- Under the influence of above systems: a) Widespread rainfall with isolated heavy to very heavy falls very likely over Odisha, Gangetic West Bengal & Jharkhand today, the 26th; over Chhattisgarh, Vidarbha, East Madhya Pradesh during 26th-28th; over West Madhya Pradesh on 28th & 29th and over East Rajasthan on 29th & 30th August, 2020. b) Isolated extremely heavy falls also very likely over Odisha today, the 26th; over Chhattisgarh on 26th & 27th; over Vidarbha on 27th and over East Madhya Pradesh on 27th & 28th August, 2020. c) Isolated heavy falls very likely over northwest India till 29th August, 2020. Isolated heavy to very heavy falls are also very likely over Jammu Division today, the 26th; over Uttarakhand on 27th & 28th and over East Uttar Pradesh on 28th August, 2020.
- Moderate thunderstorm accompanied with lightning at isolated places very likely over Jammu & Kashmir, Ladakh, Gilgit-Baltistan, Muzaffarabad, Himachal Pradesh, Punjab, East Uttar Pradesh, East Rajasthan, Bihar and Jharkhand during next 24 hours.

4. Other Incident-

- (i) Landslide in Kerala Update: Landslide occurred on 07.08.2020 in Tata tea Company Pettimudi, Munnar, Kerala. 65 persons have been reported dead, 12 persons got injured and 05 persons are still missing. The first stage of searching has put to an end by the authorities because of the search of the fifth consecutive day goes in vain. Searching operation for the five missing persons will be resumed when the water level of the river will become normal.
- (ii) Building collapsed in Maharashtra: A five storey building (Tarik Garden) collapsed on 24.08.2020 at village Kajalpura area, Tehsil- Mahad, District Raigad, Maharashtra. 16 dead bodies have been recovered and 09 persons got injured. Search and rescue operation continue for clearing debris by NDRF, Fire, Police and DDMA team.
