Sir,

I am directed to say that the Ministry of Home Affairs being the nodal Ministry for overseeing the operation of CRF Scheme is required to monitor the scheme to ensure its proper functioning. It has accordingly been decided that in addition to the utilization certificate which is submitted by the States to the Ministry of Finance (Department of Expenditure), the State Governments may also submit a quarterly statement of expenditure incurred from CRF/NCCF in the prescribed proforma attached. The proforma may be submitted within 15 days at the end of every quarter indicating the expenditure figures on cumulative basis. It is suggested to the States that for proper compilation of the information as per the prescribed proforma, they may advise sanctioning authorities to indicate the code numbers in the sanctions as in the proforma which is based on the norms.

The States are requested to start sending the proforma from the quarter ending 31st March, 2003 for the current year and thereafter for the next financial year.
