(A) Deep Depression over northeast Madhya Pradesh and adjoining South Uttar Pradesh: -

- Yesterday's deep depression over southwest Bihar and adjoining northwest Jharkhand moved nearly west-northwestwards and lay centered at 0830 hours, the 4th August over northeast Madhya Pradesh and adjoining South Uttar Pradesh near about:

- about 60 km south-southeast of Banda (Uttar Pradesh).
 - 120 km west-southwest of Khajuraho (Madhya Pradesh).
 - 220 km east-southeast of Jhansi (Uttar Pradesh).
- It is likely to continue to move west-northwestwards across north Madhya Pradesh and adjoining South Uttar Pradesh and weaken gradually into a depression during next 12 hours.

(B) Low Pressure Area over Southwest Rajasthan & adjoining South Pakistan: -

- The low-pressure area over West Rajasthan and adjoining Pakistan moved nearly westwards and lay over Southwest Rajasthan & adjoining South Pakistan at 0830 hours, the 4th August, 2024. It is likely to continue to move nearly westwards during next 12 hours.

Massive Landslide incident in District- Wayanad, Kerala: -

On 30.07.2024 at about 0217 hrs, due to incessant and heavy to extremely heavy rainfall, a major landslide incident occurred at Mundakki, Chooralmala, Vellarimala Village, Meppadi Panchayat, Vythiri taluk in District Wayanad. More than 400 houses / shops were reported buried under the debris during the landslide. A total of 221 persons have been pronounced dead so far, 344 persons are injured, 214 persons rescued alive and many people are still missing. A bridge connecting these villages has been washed away thereby making the affected areas difficult to access. The village has an approximate population of 2000. Massive landslide has disconnected many parts of the Taluk from remaining areas and many are stranded.

Cloud burst / flash flood incidents in Himachal Pradesh: -

As per latest report received from SEOC Himachal Pradesh, a total of 07 persons are reported died, 46 persons missing and 11 persons evacuated. A total of 95 houses, 14 bridges, 10 shops, 04 schools, 19 cattle sheds and 16 vehicles were damaged/ washed away during the cloud burst incident and flash flood incidents in districts of Shimla, Kullu and Mandi.

Status Of Stranded Pilgrims in District - Rudraprayag Uttarakhand: -

Due to heavy to very rainfall incident and landslide incidents on 31.07.2024, some bridges and roads were damaged/blocked between Lincholi and Bhimbali area on Rudraprayag- Shri Kedarnath Dham route in district-Rudraprayag Uttarakhand. Due to this incident approximately 350 pilgrims are stranded on Rudraprayag- Shri Kedarnath Dham route. Till now, a total of 9,580 persons have been rescued/evacuated safely with the help of IAF helicopters, Civil helicopters, NDRF, SDRF, Police and local administration. Efforts for rescue of remaining pilgrims is in progress by NDRF, SDRF, IAF, Army, Police and local administration. 01 person reported dead and 01 person got injured, so far.

- Safe evacuation of pilgrims is being done by 01 MI-17 and 01 Chinook helicopter of the IAF.
- Today a total of 400 pilgrims rescued / evacuated safely and till now a total of 9,993 pilgrims/persons have been rescued / evacuated safely by NDRF, SDRF, IAF, Army, Police and local administration.
- 01 Column of Army along with engineers team mobilized to affected areas.
- District administration issued Helpline numbers: - 01364-233727, 2331077, 7579257572.

Today NIL reports received from 07 States/UTs: - Arunachal Pradesh, Bihar, Mizoram, Tamil Nadu, Andaman & Nicobar, Dadra Nagar Haveli and Daman & Diu and Jammu & Kashmir.

Today reports not received from 17 States/UTs: - Andhra Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Goa, Haryana, Jharkhand, Manipur, Nagaland, Odisha, Rajasthan, Sikkim, Telangana, West Bengal, Chandigarh, Delhi, Lakshadweep, Puducherry and Ladakh.

- 3. Deployment of NDRF:** - Total of 176 teams of NDRF has been prepositioned/deployed across the country. State/UTs wise deployment is attached as Annexure- III.

Annexure - I

Detail report regarding Massive Landslide Incident in District- Wayanad, Kerala as on 04.08.2024.

Background: -

On 30.07.2024 at about 0217 hrs, due to incessant and heavy to extremely heavy rainfall, a major landslide incident occurred at Mundakki, Chooralmala, Vellarimala Village, Meppadi Panchayat, Vythiri taluk in District Wayanad. More than 400 houses / shops were reported buried under the debris. Few more landslides were occurred at the same area in later hours. A total of 221 persons have been pronounced dead so far, 344 persons were injured, 214 persons rescued alive and many people are still missing. A bridge has been washed away thereby making the affected area difficult to access. The village has an approximate population of 2000. Massive landslide has disconnected many parts of the Taluk from remaining areas and many persons are still stranded.

Assistance Sought by the State: -

- The State had initially requested for the deployment of 03 NDRF teams, 02 IAF helicopters (MI17 & 1 ALH), and 02 Defence Security Corps teams. Subsequently additional support was requested to include Engineer Task Force (ETF) from Bangalore with Bailey Bridges, two columns from the Army Pangode Base, medical personnel and relief from the Coast Guard, and a river crossing team from Navy ex-INS Zamorin.
- Today State administration requested 04 additional Cadaver dogs for identify live stranded individual and dead bodies also requested for helicopter for airlift of dead bodies and body parts found deep inside the forest in the river channel.

Current Situation:

- As reported today by State Emergency Operational Centre (SEOC) Kerala, till now a total of 221 dead bodies and 99 body parts have been retrieved, 344 persons are injured, 214 persons rescued alive and approximately 206 persons are still missing (excluding guest workers and tourist). All the injured persons have been admitted in different hospitals of Wayanad, Kozhikode and Malappuram districts.
- Till now, a total of 5,104 people were rescued /evacuated and shifted to hospitals / relief camps.
- A total of 91 injured persons are admitted in different hospitals and 253 persons have been discharged from hospitals.
- A total of 8,988 population have been affected and currently a total of 8,988 people are accommodated in 78 relief camps in Wayanad district.
- Approximately 400 houses/shops have been reported damaged in landslide affected area of Wayanad district.
- A Drone based operation with the help of 02 sets UAV based sub-soil scanner has been started to get good results in search and rescue operation.
- Other specialized equipments such as M-6 Zaver radar & REECO radar along with 06 Operators have been deployed by Indian Army for search and rescue operation.
- A total of 47 excavators, 02 JCBs, 02 Tractors, 01 Hydraulic Cutter, 32 Wood Cutter and 13 electric jack hammers are deployed for removing/cleaning the debris and wooden logs.

- IAF helicopters are operating search and rescue operation in the affected areas from Calicut airport.
- IAF helicopters are dropping food and water in affected villages.
- More than 1200 rescuers of NDRF, Army, Air force, Navy, Indian Coast Guard, Fire services, Civil defence, Police and local ERT have been deployed for rescue and relief operation.
- More than 100 ambulances along with doctors and other medical staff have been deployed for medical support and treatment by local administration and Armed Forces.
- A total of 14 Columns of Indian Army including 05 medical teams and Engineer Task Force have been deployed for rescue and relief operation.
- 05 Sniffing and Cadaver dogs are deployed for search and rescue operation.
- A total of 06 helicopters were deployed by IAF / Navy. Out of which 04 helicopters de-inducted and currently 02 IAF helicopters are conducting rescue and relief operation. Today Garud commandos have been also deployed by Indian Air Force to augment the ongoing the rescue and relief operation.
- On 02.08.2024 State government of Kerala declared Meppadi Grama Panchayath including Kottapadi Village, Vellarmala Village and Thrikaipetta Village of Vythiri Taluk of Wayanad district disaster affected area from 30.07.2024.
- A cabinet Sub-Committee comprising of four cabinet Ministers (Revenue & Housing, Forest & Wildlife, SCST Development, PWD) is constituted for overall guidance of the search, rescue and relief work by State government of Kerala.
- Search and rescue operation is underway by NDRF, Army, Air force, Indian Navy, Indian Coast Guard, Civil defence, Fire service, Police and local administration.

Significant rainfall recorded in Kerala: (As per IMD)

- On 30th July 2024, the state of Kerala reported widespread light to moderate rainfall with Heavy to very heavy rainfall at many places and extremely heavy rainfall at isolated places.
- The extremely heavy rainfall was mainly confined to districts over north and central parts of Kerala.
- Highest Rainfall recorded between 29-07-2024, 0830 hrs to 30.07-2024, 0830 hrs
Thrissur – 340 mm, Palakkad - 300 mm, Kozhikode – 280 mm, Wayanad – 280 mm, Kannur – 250 mm, Malappuram – 250 mm, Idukki – 200 mm.

- Highest Rainfall recorded between 30-07-2024, 0830 hrs to 31-07-2024, 0830 hrs Kasargod – 130 mm, Palakkad - 110 mm- Kannur, 90 mm- Ernakulam, 80 mm- Thissur & Kozhikode and 70 mm- Malappuram.
- Average Rainfall recorded during last 24 hrs in the state – 10 mm.
- Today, Light rainfall reported in Wayanad district.

IMD Forecast:

- Moderate rainfall and surface wind speed likely to be 40 kmph is likely to occur at one or two places in Pathanamthitta, Alappuzha, Kottayam, Ernakulam, Thrissur, Malappuram and Kozhikode districts.
- Light rainfall is likely to occur at one or two places in all other districts of Kerala in the next 03 hours.

Step taken by the Central Government:

- Situation is being monitored by Central Government at the highest level.
- Both control room of MHA are monitoring the situation 24X7 and all possible help is being provided to the state.
- Honourable Prime Minister is monitoring the situation and has deputed Sh. George Kurian, Minister of State for Minority Affair & Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairy, to visit the affected areas.
- Honourable Home Minister has spoken to the Honourable Chief Minister of Kerala and assured him that every possible assistance is being provided by the Government of India.
- Immediately after the incident rescue teams of NDRF, Army, Air Force, Navy and Indian Coast Guard mobilized to incident site for rescue and relief operation.

Deployment of National Disaster Response Force (NDRF): -

- 04 Team of NDRF along with necessary equipments have been deployed for search and rescue operation at incident site.
- Till now, a total of 30 persons have been rescued, 502 persons evacuated and 106 dead bodies retrieved by NDRF rescue teams.

Deployment of Armed Forces:

Army: -

- A total of 14 Columns of Indian Army including 05 medical teams and Engineer Task Force have been deployed for rescue and relief operation.
- Indian Army troops rescued / evacuated more than 125 stranded labourers.
- On 01.08.2024 the construction work of Bailey bridge was completed by Indian Army and made functional for rescue and relief operation and vehicular movement.

Air Force: -

- 04 IAF helicopters of Air Force have been deployed for rescue and relief operation.
- On 03.08.2024, 03 stranded injured persons rescued by IAF Helicopters.
- On 03.08.2024, 02 injured persons evacuated from Soojiparahill to Chooralmala near Bailey bridge by IAF helicopters.
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Indian Navy: -

- 02 Indian Navy helicopters have been deployed for rescue and relief operation.
- Indian Navy ship - INS Zamorin has been pre-positioned in that area is assisting the local administration in rescue and relief operation.
- 01 Indian Navy columns from Kozhikode have been deployed at incident site and 69 persons team including medical team of Indian Navy with river crossing team deployed for rescue and relief operation.

Indian Coast Guard (ICG): -

- Indian Coast Guard Disaster Response Teams are undertaking rescue and relief operation at Chooralmala, Wayanad in coordination with other agencies.
- ICG Disaster response teams carried out search / combing operation on banks of Iruvazhinji river, Chooralmala, Wayanad.
- ICG Disaster response teams located 03 survivors and rescued 01 survivor in coordination with Army and also coordinated with Indian Air Force for airlift of 02 injured survivors from Soojipara waterfalls on 03rd August, 2024.
- Additional 03 Disaster Response Teams (DRTs) (02-Kochi and 01-Baypore, consisting of 05 personnel each) are kept standby for mobilization on short notice.
- ICG aircraft (ALH MK III) carried out in affected area. Aircraft is kept standby in SAR configuration at Kochi for rescue and relief operation in coordination with Task Force Commander (TFC), subject to weather conditions.

Detail report regarding Cloud burst / flash flood incidents in Himachal Pradesh as on 04.08.2024

As per latest report received from SEOC Himachal Pradesh, on 04.08.2024 a total of 07 persons reported dead, 46 persons missing and 11 persons evacuated. A total of 95 houses, 14 bridges, 10 shops, 04 schools, 19 cattle sheds and 16 vehicles damaged / washed away in cloud burst and flash flood incidents in districts Shimla, Kullu and Mandi. The details are as under: -

Cloudburst incident in Rampur, Shimla: -

- Due to incessant and very heavy rainfall, a Cloudburst incident occurred on 01.08.2024 at 0447 hrs near Hydro power project near Jhakri in Rampur Tehsil district Shimla. This resulted in approximately 33 persons missing and 10 persons evacuated. A total of 30 houses, 03 bridges, 01 school and 04 vehicles damaged/washed away.
- 03 rescue dogs of India Army and NDRF have been deployed for search of bodies buried under the debris.
- 02 drones and Recco radar additionally deployed at incident site for search operation.
- Strengthening of the footbridge connecting the connecting the cutoff part of the village has been completed and another footbridge is being constructed for the second crossing to facilitate search teams and villagers movement.
- A total of 03 teams of NDRF, 01 team of ITBP, 01 team of SDRF and 01 team of Home Guard along with necessary equipments were mobilized for search and rescue operation. Search and rescue operations are underway by NDRF, ITBP, SDRF, Police, Home guard and local administration.

Cloudburst Incident in Padhar, Mandi: -

- Due to incessant and very heavy rainfall, a cloudburst incident occurred on 01.08.2024 at 0228 hrs near Village Tikkan Thalukot, Padhar Tehsil in district Mandi. This has resulted in 06 person reported dead, approximately 04 persons missing and 01 person evacuated safely. A total of 04 houses and 01 cattle shed damaged/washed away.

- 01 team of NDRF along with necessary equipments was mobilized for search and rescue operation. Search and rescue operation is underway by NDRF, Police and local administration.

Cloud Burst incident in Kullu: -

- Due to incessant and very heavy rainfall, a cloudburst incident occurred on 01.08.2024 at 0138 hrs near Village Jaon in Tehsil Nirmand, district Kullu. This resulted in the water level of Kurpan canal to rise significantly, behind Singhad Base Camp near the Shrikhand Mahadev Yatra route. In this incident 01 person died and 09 persons are missing. A total of 61 houses, 18 cattle sheds, 11 bridges, 10 shops, 03 schools and 12 vehicles damaged/washed away.

Flash flood incidents: -

- A flash flood incident occurred on 01.08.2024 at 0542 hrs near Malana, sub tehsil Jari in district Kullu. This has resulted in flood like situation in River Parvati near (Malana-I) and Malana, a bridge washed away and the nearest road reported completely blocked. No loss of life has been reported in this incident.
- Search and rescue operation called off on 02.08.2024.

Deployment of National Disaster Response Force (NDRF): -

- 04 NDRF teams are presently engaged in Search and rescue (SAR) operation (Shimla- 03 and Mandi-01) at Cloud Burst incident site in Himachal Pradesh and 01 team de-inducted from district Kullu on 02.08.2024.
- On 03.08.2024, 01 dead body retrieved by NDRF rescue teams.
- Till now a total of 05 dead body retrieved, 26 persons evacuated, 11 person and 04 livestock rescued by NDRF rescue teams.
