Massive Landslide incident in District- Wayanad, Kerala: -

On 30.07.2024 at about 0217 hrs, due to incessant and heavy to extremely heavy rainfall, a major landslide incident occurred at Mundakki, Chooralmala, Vellarimala Village, Meppadi Panchayat, Vythiri taluk in District Wayanad. More than 400 houses / shops were reported buried under the debris during the landslide. A total of 229 persons have been pronounced dead so far.

Cloud burst / flash flood incidents in Himachal Pradesh: -

- As per latest report received from SEOC Himachal Pradesh on 11.08.2024, till now a total 28 deaths have been reported due to above cloud burst and flash flood incidents and 55 persons are still missing. Out of 28 dead bodies 15 dead bodies have been identified and 13 dead bodies remain unidentified. Efforts for remaining 55 missing persons are still in progress. A total of 55 persons evacuated and 96 houses, 14 bridges, 17 shops, 04 schools, 19 cattle sheds and 16 vehicles were damaged/washed away during the cloud burst incident and flash flood incidents in districts of Shimla, Kullu and Mandi.

Detailed report regarding Massive Landslide Incident in District- Wayanad, Kerala as on 11.08.2024.

Background:

On 30.07.2024 at about 0217 hrs, due to incessant and heavy to extremely heavy rainfall, a major landslide incident occurred at Mundakki, Chooralmala, Vellarimala Village, Meppadi Panchayat, Vythiri taluk in District Wayanad. More than 400 houses/ shops were reported buried under the debris. Few more landslides occurred at the same area in later hours. A bridge has been washed away thereby making the affected area difficult to access. The village has an approximate population of 2000. Massive landslide had disconnected many parts of the Taluk from remaining areas.

Current Status

- As reported today by the State Emergency Operational Centre (SEOC) Kerala, till now a total of 229 dead bodies and 200 body parts have been retrieved, 378 persons are injured, 214 persons rescued/evacuated alive and approximately 138 persons are still missing.
- A total of 75 injured persons are admitted in different hospitals and 322 persons have been discharged from hospitals.
- A total of 178 dead bodies handed over to their relatives.
- A total of 51 unidentified dead bodies buried by districts administration.
- A total of 1,798 affected people are currently accommodated in 15 relief camps.
- A total of 1555 houses, 100 other buildings, 290 MSME/ shops, 124 km electricity (LT) , 02 transformers, Rural road - 1.5 km, Bridges-03 and 626 hectare crop area have been reported damaged/ affected so far.
- A total of 54 excavators, 07 JCBs, 02 Tractors, 01 Hydraulic Cutter, 32 Wood Cutter and 13 electric jack hammers are deployed for removing/cleaning the debris and wooden logs.
- More than 1500 rescuers of NDRF, Army, Air force, Navy, Fire services, Civil defence, Police and local ERT were deployed for rescue and relief operation.
- Rescue teams of Army, Navy and Coast Guard (except MEG/ETF and Dog squad) have been de-inducted.
- More than 100 ambulances along with doctors and other medical staff were deployed for medical support and treatment by local administration and Armed Forces.

- Search and rescue operation is underway by NDRF, Army, Air force, Civil defence, Fire service, Police and local administration.

Prime Minister Visit of district Wayanad, Kerala: -

- On 10.08.2024, Hon'ble Prime Minister accompanied with Chief Minister of Kerala and Governor of Kerala undertook an aerial survey in the landslide hit Chooral Mala Mundakkai and Punchirimattom hamlets in Wayanad.
- The Prime Minister visited and inspected the landslide-hit areas after an aerial survey in Wayanad, Kerala.
- Hon'ble Prime Minister visited the relief camp of Meppadi and interacted with the inmates of the camp who survived the landslide.
- Hon'ble Prime Minister attended the Administrative Committee meeting at the Collectorate and discussed on the response and relief activities with senior officials and the Ministers and returned to Kannur Airport.

Step taken by the Central Government:

- Situation is being monitored by Central Government at the highest level.
- Both control room of MHA are monitoring the situation 24X7 and all possible help is being provided to the state.

Inter-Ministerial Central team (IMCT):

- An Inter-Ministerial Central team (IMCT) has been constituted by the Central Government, visited the affected areas of the State from 08.08.2024 to 10.08.2024.

Efforts made by Integrated Defence Staff (IDS) and NDRF

- After the incident NDRF, Army, Air force, Indian Navy and Coast Guard immediately mobilised the resources for rescue and relief operation at incident site.
- Teams deployed:
 1. **NDRF** – 4 Teams;
 2. **DSC** - 2 Columns;
 3. **Coast Guard** – (A total 03 Disaster Response teams (DRTs) were deployed for rescue and relief operation and some additional assets were kept on standby. On 06.08.2024, all the Disaster Response teams have been de-inducted and relieved from rescue operations)
 4. **Navy** – 1 Team (02 Indian Navy helicopters were deployed for rescue and relief operation. Indian Navy ship - INS Zamorin, pre-positioned in that area, is assisting the local administration in rescue and relief operation).
 5. **Army** - 582 Army Personnel (16 officers & 566 rescuers);

6. **Air force** – 2 Choppers (MI 17 & Mi5) at Calicut Air Force choppers kept standby at Trivandrum, Sullur, Bangalore and Tanjavur. (A total 04 IAF helicopters were deployed out of which 02 helicopters were de-inducted).

- ***The Indian Army erected a 190-foot Bailey bridge in Wayanad and it has been crucial in facilitating the movement of heavy machinery and ambulances.***

Status of National Disaster Response Force (NDRF): -

04 Teams of NDRF along with necessary equipments were deployed for search and rescue operation at incident site. Till now, NDRF has rescued alive a total of 30 persons, evacuated 520 persons, 11 livestock and retrieved 112 dead bodies. IG NDRF visited the affected area w.e.f. 31.07.2024 to 02.08.2024. DG NDRF visited the affected area from 07.08.2024 to 10.08.2024.

Status of Armed Forces:

Army: -

- A total of 14 Columns of Indian Army including 05 medical teams, Engineer Task Force and dog squad were deployed for rescue and relief operation.
- All the columns de-inducted except MEG/ETF and Dog squad.
- Indian Army troops rescued / evacuated more than 125 stranded labourers.

Air Force: -

- A total of 04 IAF helicopters were deployed out of which 02 helicopters were de-inducted and currently 02 helicopters along with Garud Commandos are deployed for rescue and relief operation.
- A total of 56 sorties has been carried out by IAF helicopters so far and dropped 710 kg relief materials to the affected population.
- On 03.08.2024, 03 stranded injured were evacuated from Soojiparahill to Chooralmala near Bailey bridge by IAF helicopters.

Indian Navy: -

- 02 Indian Navy helicopters were deployed for rescue and relief operation.
- Indian Navy ship - INS Zamorin has been pre-positioned in that area is assisting the local administration in rescue and relief operation.

- 01 Indian Navy column from Kozhikode have been deployed at incident site and 69 person's team including medical team of Indian Navy with river crossing team deployed for rescue and relief operation.

Indian Coast Guard (ICG): -

- A total of 03 Disaster Response teams (DRTs) were deployed for rescue and relief operation and some additional assets were kept on standby. All the teams have been de-inducted.

Detailed report regarding Cloud burst / flash flood incidents in Himachal Pradesh as on 11.08.2024

- On 01.08.2024, due to incessant and very heavy rainfall, a total 03 massive cloud burst incidents and 01 flash flood incident occurred in different districts of Himachal Pradesh, first cloud burst incident occurred at 0447 hrs near hydro power project, Jhakari in Tehsil Rampur, district Shimla, second cloud burst incident occurred at 0228 hrs near village Tikkan Thalukot of Padhar tehsil in district Mandi, third cloud burst incident occurred at 0138 hrs near Village Jaon of Nirmand tehsil in district Kullu and flash flood incident occurred at 0542 hrs near Malana area of sub tehsil Jari in district Kullu.
- As per initial report received from SEOC Himachal Pradesh on 01.08.2024, in these incidents a total 04 persons were reported dead, 55 persons missing and 09 persons stranded, 19 houses damaged, 03 bridges and 01 bus washed away. After the incidents rescue teams of NDRF, SDRF, fire service and Police were immediately mobilized to incident site for rescue and relief operation.

Current Status

- As per latest report received from SEOC Himachal Pradesh on 11.08.2024, till now a total 28 death have been reported due to above cloud burst and flash flood incidents and 55 persons are still missing. Out of 28 dead bodies, 15 dead bodies have been identified and 13 dead bodies remain unidentified. Efforts for remaining 55 missing persons are still in progress.
- Districts wise status are as under: -

Cloudburst incident in Rampur, Shimla: -

- As reported today by the State Emergency Operational Centre (SEOC) Himachal Pradesh, till now a total of 15 dead bodies retrieved, 10 persons rescued/evacuated and 33 persons are still missing.
- A total of 31 houses, 03 bridges, 01 school and 04 vehicles reported damaged/washed away so far.
- 04 rescue dogs (Indian Army-02 and NDRF-02) have been deployed for search of bodies buried under the debris.
- 02 drones and Recco radar additionally deployed at incident site for search operation.

- Strengthening of the footbridge connecting the cutoff part of the village has been completed and another footbridge is being constructed for the second crossing to facilitate search teams and villagers' movement.
- A total of 03 teams of NDRF, 02 teams of ITBP, 01 team of CISF and 01 team of Home Guard along with necessary equipments have been deployed for search and rescue operation.
- 02 Columns of Indian Army along with special equipments, drones, recce Radar and dog squads have been deployed for rescue and relief operation.
- Search and rescue operation is underway by NDRF, Army, ITBP, CISF, Police, Home guard, Forest Guard and local administration.

Relief Measures taken by District Administration: -

- An amount of Rs 20,15,000/- has been distributed to 31 persons whose houses were affected.
- Rashan Kit 27, Blanket 54 and tarpaulins 32 were distributed among the 36 families.
- To accelerate the pace of Search & Rescue Operation, Deputy Commissioner Shimla has requisitioned 06 excavators from SJVNL.
- District Administration Shimla coordinated with District Administration Kullu, Mandi, Kangra, Bilaspur, Panchkula and Ambala for divers.
- District Administration has ordered District Treasury Officer to remain open till 12 AM for distribution of emergency relief.
- District Administration has set-up communication control room at Samej for smooth information dissemination.
- Restoration work is in progress in all affected areas.

Cloudburst Incident in Padhar, Mandi: -

- As reported today by the State Emergency Operational Centre (SEOC) Himachal Pradesh, till now a total of 09 dead body retrieved, 01 person rescued/evacuated and 10 persons are still missing.
- A total of 04 houses and 01 cattle shed damaged/washed away so far.
- 01 team of NDRF along with necessary equipments and dog squad have been deployed for search and rescue operation.
- Search and rescue operation is underway by NDRF, SDRF, Police and local administration.
- Restoration work is in progress in all affected areas.

Relief Measures taken by District Administration: -

- ₹4 lakh each relief given to the families of all 9 recovered bodies (36 Lakh) and 1 Injured – Rs.15,000 rupees given (total Rs 36.15 Lakh).
- The administration distributed bedding (11 sets), blankets (11), Gas cylinders (4), kitchen sets (4) and tarpaulins (10) to the affected families.
- Further, drone surveillance was conducted to assist in the operation.

Cloud Burst incident in Kullu: -

- As reported today by the State Emergency Operational Centre (SEOC) Himachal Pradesh, till now a total of 04 dead body retrieved, 44 persons rescued/evacuated and 12 persons are still missing.
- A total of 61 houses, 18 cattle sheds, 11 bridges, 17 shops, 03 schools and 12 vehicles damaged/washed away.
- Search and rescue operation is underway by SDRF, Police and local administration.

Relief Measures taken by District Administration: -

- The administration distributed Rs. 08 Lakhs, Rathan Kits-40, tarpaulins - 50 and hygiene kits 20 were distributed to all the affected families.
- Deployed SAR Team, comprises personnel's from SDRF, ITBP and Home Guards.
- Deployed earth removers such as 01 JCB and 01 LNT.
- Restoration work is in progress in all affected areas.

Flash flood incidents: -

- A flash flood incident occurred on 01.08.2024 at 0542 hrs near Malana, sub tehsil Jari in district Kullu. This has resulted in flood like situation in River Parvati near (Malana-I) and Malana, a bridge was washed away and the nearest road reported completely blocked. No loss of life has been reported in this incident.
- Search and rescue operation called off on 02.08.2024.

Efforts made by Integrated defence Staff (IDS) and NDRF: -

- After the incidents NDRF, Army and ITBP immediately mobilised the resources for rescue and relief operation at incident site.

Teams Deployed:

- **NDRF:** - 04 teams
- **ITBP-** 02 teams
- **Army** - 02 Columns
- Rescue teams of NDRF, ITBP and Army assisted the local administration in search and rescue operation and construction of footbridges with the help of special equipments, drone, recce Radar and dogs.

Deployment of Armed Forces and National Disaster Response Force: -

Army: -

- 02 Columns of Indian Army along with special equipments, drones, recce Radar and 02 dogs have been deployed for rescue and relief operation.
- Medical and veterinary aid under progress by Indian Army.
- Construction of Footbridges is in progress by Indian Army.

NDRF: -

- A total of 04 teams of NDRF are deployed and 10 teams are prepositioned in the State for rescue and relief operation.
- 04 NDRF teams are presently engaged in Search and rescue operation (Shimla- 03 and Mandi-01) at Cloud Burst incident site in Himachal Pradesh and 01 team de-inducted from district Kullu on 02.08.2024.
- Till now a total of 16 dead bodies retrieved, 30 persons evacuated, 11 person and 05 livestock rescued by NDRF rescue teams.

Step taken by State Government: -

- After the incident, the State Government immediately mobilised State Disaster response Force (SDRF-15 personnel), SDM Rural Shimla, Police (50 personnel's), Home Guard & Civil Defense 02nd & 03rd BN (46 personnel's), PWD teams with machinery, Health Services to assist Search & Rescue Operation at Samej Khad.
- For efficient Search and Rescue Operation, various resources were also requisitioned viz. 01 streamer boat was requisitioned from Koldam, District Bilaspur and also District Administration Mandi for clearance of stagnant point at Dhanyara Panchayat, Nihri Panchayat.
- Hon'ble Chief Minister Sh. Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu convened an emergency meeting at HP Secretariat in response to the situation following the cloudburst. The Hon'ble CM visited the cloudburst site at Samej in Rampur area of Shimla district which has borne the maximum brunt of the cloudburst. He also reviewed the ongoing relief and rehabilitation efforts.
- State Emergency operation centre (SEOC) is functioning 24x7 and monitoring the situation.
